Workplace violence is a problem for workers and employers of staggering scale.

From an employee's point of view, 500,000 employees impacted by workplace violence lose 1,175,000 work days and \$55 million in lost wages.

From an employer's point of view, workplace violence is a business and financial challenge. Workplace violence costs companies \$121 billion every year, including costs associated with lost productivity, brand and reputational damage, legal expenses, property damage, and increased security costs.
